Local Information

Sessions and Presentations

1. All rooms are equipped with Overhead Projectors (OHPs) and computer projection facilities. There is a desktop computer in each room and also a cable for connection to your laptop.
2. We advise you to bring your presentation materials on a flash drive, and also to bring acetates as a backup. As a further backup, we will accept and load up for you any files which you email to res2007papers@warwick.ac.uk prior to Monday April 2nd 2007. If you do email us any files for this purpose please name the file yoursurname_yourfirstname.filetype [e.g. smith_jeremy.ppt].
3. In each room the internal computer has the Microsoft Office suite of programmes plus a pdf reader and internet access.

General Sessions

1. General Sessions are 90 minutes long with three speakers per session. Each speaker is expected to restrict their presentation to about 20-25 minutes with 5-10 minutes for questions and answers.
2. The General Session chair is the last-named presenter in the session and has the responsibility of time-keeping throughout the session. In the event that one speaker fails to turn up on the day, the session chair should still allocate about 30 minutes to each paper and should run the presentations continuously from the announced start time.

Conference Registration

1. Registration for the Conference will take place on the ground floor of the Rootes Social Building (number 47) from **10h30 to 15h30** on the first day of the Conference. You will be given your delegate's bag, which will include the programme of the Conference, other useful information, as well as your Conference badge.

2. From **15h30 onwards** on the first day of the Conference and for the subsequent two days, registration for the Conference will move to the main Foyer of the Ramphal Building (number **45**), which is the main Conference venue.

Residential Check-in and Accommodation

1. In addition to registering for the Conference you will need to check-in at the Reception Desk located on the ground floor of the Rootes Building. Bedrooms will normally be available from 15h00 only, but you will be able to leave your luggage in storage at the Reception of the Rootes Building. The Reception Desk remains in the Rootes building throughout the Conference.
2. Your bedroom will be located in either Arthur Vick (number **4**) or Jack Martin (number **29**) Residences. Note that rooms are networked for internet access (see below) but do not have telephones.
3. All bedrooms are networked for free internet access (for computers with an Ethernet network card) – you are advised to bring an Ethernet cable with you.

Conference venue

The main Conference venue is the Ramphal Building (number **45**). Some sessions will also take place in other rooms located in the Social Studies Building (number **52**, where the Department of Economics is located), the Library (number **32**), Physics (number **42**) and Humanities (number **24**).

Meals

1. The Conference will then begin with a buffet lunch in the Ramphal Building (number **45**) at 12noon, followed by the first general sessions from 13h30 to 15h00. On each of the following two days of the Conference buffet lunches will also be served in the main Foyer of the Ramphal Building.
2. Evening dinners (on both Wednesday and Thursday evenings) will take place in the Panorama Room on the second floor of the Rootes Social Building. Breakfast will also be taken in Rootes Social Building. More detailed information will be provided in the programme included in your pack.

Internet

A computer room with 4 laptops connected to the Internet will be available during the whole Conference on the first floor of the Ramphal Building. Other computer rooms can also be accessed around the campus. A number of wireless hotspots are also available. Once you will arrive at the Conference, you will be given a login and password that will enable you to access any computer connected to the University network.

How to get to the University's central campus

By train

1. The nearest rail station for the University is **Coventry**, which is easily reached from London (Euston), Birmingham (New Street) and Leicester, all of which run regular and frequent services direct to Coventry. The station that serves Birmingham Airport is Birmingham International.

2. From Coventry's station, there are frequent local bus services to the University. Follow the signs to Warwick Road (a 2 minute walk) and from there catch the West Midlands services 12 and 12A which travel onto the main campus. The Stagecoach service X12 also travels along Warwick Road and onto the Central campus. On campus alight at the bus stop indicated in the box **C5** on the attached map, on the left of the Arts Centre Building (number **59** on the map).
3. Taxis are also available from outside the station (the journey should cost between £8-£10).

By air

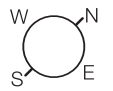
